Requirements for Local Delivery

1. A venue, presumably your church or church hall. The talk should last between 30 and 45 minutes plus time for questions / debate.
2. Someone to deliver the talks but, equally, this could be shared among a small group of capable speakers, provided they have some basic theological understanding.
3. Someone to field questions and to manage the interaction with the attendees during or after the lecture. This person should be either one of the clergy or someone who has completed the E-Quip Diploma. Clergy do not need to have completed the Diploma as these are assumed to know and understand the content. [2 and 3 could be covered by the same person(s)]
4. Ideally there should be tea and biscuits afterwards – informal conversations in this time often consolidate learning.
5. If any of the attendees at any point in the Course wish to complete the Diploma, please refer them to the FAQ's and Registration pages of the website.
6. If you have access to a projector and screen, lecture slides can be provided BUT these are not necessary for delivery and understanding of the lectures. If you want these slides, let me know.
